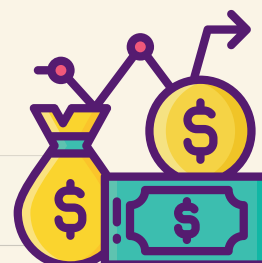

- Undergraduate:
 - Home Students: CAD\$7,000 to CAD\$15,000 per year
 - International Students: CAD\$15,000 to CAD\$30,000 per year (depending on the course)
- Postgraduate:
 - Home Students: CAD\$7,000 to CAD\$18,000 per year
 - International Students: CAD\$13,000 to CAD\$35,000 per year (depending on the program)

Cost of Living:

- Toronto, Vancouver: CAD\$1,500 to CAD\$2,200 per month

Types of Post-Study Work Visas in the Canada

In 2023, thousands of Indian students secured Post-Graduation Work Permits (PGWPs), allowing them to stay and work in Canada after completing their studies. With a strong economy and high demand for skilled professionals in sectors like technology, healthcare, and engineering, Canada provides a clear pathway for international graduates to build successful careers and even transition to permanent residency.

Types of Post-Study Work Visas in Canada

- **Post-Graduation Work Permit (PGWP)**

Eligibility: Open to students who completed eligible programs (minimum 8 months) at designated institutions.

Duration: 8 months to 3 years, based on program length.

Purpose: Allows unrestricted work with any employer, facilitating valuable Canadian work experience and a pathway to permanent residency.

- **Employer- Specific Work Permit:**

Eligibility : Requires a valid job offer from a Canadian employer willing to sponsor the graduate.

Duration: Tied to the job offer or contract length.
