- Undergraduate:
 - Home Students: €3,000 to €7,000 per year (typically subsidized)
 - International Students: €9,000 to €25,000 per year (depending on the program)
- Postgraduate:
 - Home Students: €5,000 to €15,000 per year
 - International Students: €12,000 to €30,000 per year (depending on the course)

Types of Post-Study Work Visas in the Ireland

Ireland is rapidly emerging as a preferred destination for international students, offering high-quality education and strong career opportunities. In 2023, thousands of Indian students secured the Irish Third Level Graduate Programme visa, allowing them to stay and work in Ireland after completing their studies. With a thriving economy and increasing demand for skilled professionals in sectors like IT, healthcare, and finance, Ireland provides a promising pathway for international graduates to build successful careers.

Types of Post-Study Work Visas in Ireland

- **Critical Skills Employment Permit**

Eligibility: For high-demand, highly skilled occupations.

Minimum Salary: EUR 32,000 per year for some roles, EUR 64,000 per year for others (depending on the role).

Duration: 2 years (with the option to apply for permanent residency after 2 years).

Purpose: Allows graduates to work in critical sectors such as IT, engineering, healthcare, and more.

- **General Employment Permit**

Eligibility: Open to all occupations not on the Ineligible List.

Minimum Salary: EUR 30,000 per year.

Duration: Up to 2 years (renewable).

Purpose: Allows graduates to work in a wide range of sectors not specifically covered under critical skills, with the possibility of extending the permit and eventually applying for residency.

- **Internship Employment Permit**

Eligibility: For full-time students with job offers in critical skills occupations.

Duration: Up to 12 months.

Purpose: This permit is designed for students looking to gain practical experience in critical skills roles while completing their academic program.
